HKSSH-JSSH Ambassador Report

It is my honour to be the HKSSH-JSSH Ambassador in 2018. This is an invaluable opportunity to learn about Japanese practice of hand surgery. I travelled to Japan from 22 April to 5 May 2018 to visit two hospitals, and attended the 61st Annual Meeting of the JSSH in between.



My trip began in Tokyo with the visit of National Centre for Child Health and Development on 24 and 25 April 2018. It is a paediatric tertiary referral centre. Dr Shinichiro Takayama (高山真一郎) hosted me for the 2 days. I was able to observe some interesting operations including pollicisation for radial club hand and mobilisation procedure for congenital radioulnar synostosis. Dr Takayama kindly

shared with me his slides detailing the tricks and his promising results on the latter procedure.

After the visit, I attended the 61st Annual Meeting of the JSSH, which was also held in Tokyo. I was amazed by the magnitude and the efficient organisation of the meeting. There were more than 9 concurrent sessions of presentations, lectures, debates, workshops, etc running through the 2 days. Although most all sessions are conducted in Japanese, real-time interpretation (from Japanese to English and vice versa) was provided in sessions with international speaker. I presented my work on fracture-dislocation of finger proximal interphalangeal joint during the travelling fellow session. I was able to acquire new knowledge and make new friends through the meeting.





For the final part of my trip, I travel from Tokyo to Yamaguchi in southern Honshu to visit the Ogori Daiichi General Hospital on 1 and 2 May 2018. The Orthopaedic Department of this hospital is well known locally and internationally for their brachial plexus reconstruction surgery. Professor Kazuteru Doi (土井一輝), previous President of the hospital, invented the double free functional muscle transfer for complete type BPI. They have some 30-40 BPI reconstructive operations each year. They regularly have international fellows working

and learning there. Apart from joining their out-patient clinic and operating sessions, I visited their physiotherapy department and the dedicated ICU for microvascular cases. I observed and assisted in a 10-hour brachial plexus exploration and free gracilis muscle transfer for restoration of finger flexion in a BPI patient. Their use of hourly EMG (for 72 hours) for monitoring of the viability of the transferred flap was an eye-opener to me. Dr Yasunori Hattori (服部泰典) has kindly shared with me many minor but important details of the operation. Their success in this field comes with a reason.



During their Department Meeting, where I was given the opportunity to present my work, there were 2 other interesting talks - Prof Doi's talk on pitfalls in evaluating the outcomes of nerve transfer, and Dr Kota Hayashi's (林洸太) talk on the use of chicken wing for super-microvascular surgery training. The latter had inspired me on exploring the possibility of starting such training in my hospital.

I would like to thank the HKSSH and JSSH for providing me this opportunity of academic exchange in these prestigious centres. Language barrier had prevented many interesting ideas and concepts in Japan from being published in English literature. The visit has certainly bridged my gap in this area. I was able to establish new professional ties. I strongly recommend young hand surgeons to join this programme.

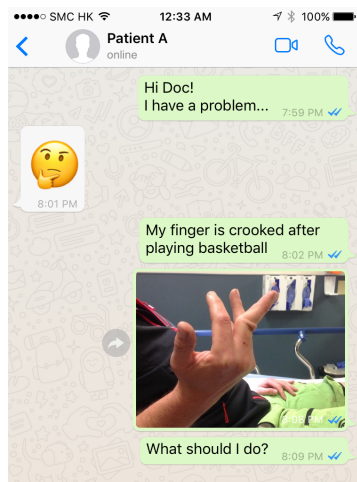

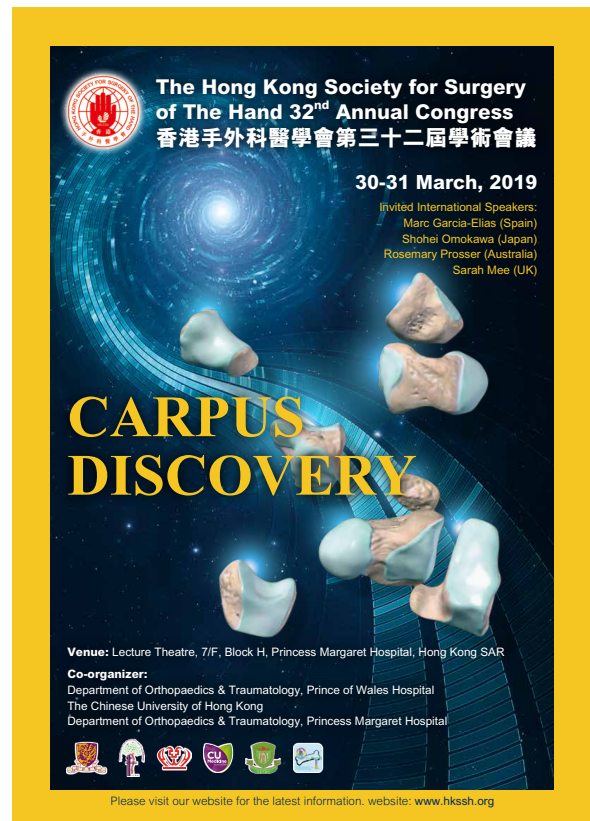
